Although we are separate parishes, we are so close together it seems to make sense to explore how we can work together on different aspects of parish life. To help move this forward, a small group of representatives from each parish will be meeting at the beginning of February to start looking at the possibilities. More information will come to us all after this meeting and there will be opportunities for us all to be involved in the discussions.

Today: It is central to our Christian lives that we are open to accepting the full implications of Incarnation. As far as his listeners were concerned, Jesus was a neighbour's child, from Nazareth, and that was the beginning and end of who and what he was. This is the great paradox of the gospel. It means that God became ordinary, he became like us in all things but sin, he is right here in the midst of us, and can easily go unnoticed. I, who write or speak these words am just a human being, no different from everyone else around me. And yet, by vocation, I have been called to proclaim the good news, to be God's spokesperson. God is incarnate in each one of us. Jesus didn't come to be locked in a tabernacle. He came to make his home in the human heart, so that, through anyone of us, he can touch the lives and hearts of others.

At the risk of sounding like an old record, playing the same tune over and over again, I want to stress that the words of the gospel today are meant for each one of us. I am sure that we have all listened to a sermon or a homily, and we wished that such and such a one was here to hear this! We all know someone somewhere to whom these words directly apply. Try and avoid that, please.... if you listen to you, then perhaps, because of your living out that word, the other person may be touched. Sometimes what we do speaks so loudly that others cannot hear what we say. (MB)

St Barnabas Cathedral, Nottingham wins National Lottery support to celebrate its 175th Anniversary We are simply delighted here at the Cathedral to have been awarded this funding as it will allow us to involve so many people in the celebrations of the Cathedral's anniversary. We do hope that the 'Discovering Pugin Project' will help us engage with the wider community in Nottingham, so that we not only as a Catholic Community, but the whole city and Diocese, can best promote the heritage of St Barnabas in the future.

We will be receiving a grant from the National Lottery for £71,100. This will help us greatly in carrying the project forward and cover a number of professional fees and costs. Here are some of the costs: Engagement Coordinator £7,200; Architect £6,000; Quantity Surveyor £2,400, Paint Researcher £5,400; mentoring and support £3,360; Nottingham Trent University Staff Input £7,986; Nottingham Trent University building scan and 3D modelling £26,479.

We are most grateful to the Heritage Lottery Fund and we "Thank" the Lottery Players for their support with this most fascinating project to explore the history of Nottingham's Catholic Cathedral.

Cathedral Choirs Tour to Lourdes & Paris: 15th July - 21st July 2019 In celebration of the Cathedral's 175th Anniversary, our Youth Choir will be joining our Cathedral Choir to lead the music in the Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes in July 2019. Settlement Scheme for EU Citizens As you will be aware, Brexit is causing uncertainty and concern to many EU citizens living in the UK. Both clergy and laity alike share this uncertainty and concern. Apart from those who are uncertain about their future, others are inevitably in a state of ignorance and unaware that Brexit will affect their immigration status. In March 2019, the Government is due to launch a Settlement Scheme. All EU citizens living in the UK will be required to make an application if they wish to remain here after Brexit. However, Irish citizens will not be required to apply as their rights are separately protected. Many parishioners, priests and religious in our Dioceses will be affected. We urge the whole Catholic community to take up Pope Francis' call to welcome, protect, promote and help to integrate everyone who has made their home here, with particular concern at present for all our European brothers and sisters. The Value and Meaning of the Scapular - The Scapular finds its roots in the tradition of the Carmelite Order, which has seen in it a sign of Mary's motherly protection. It has therefore, a centuries' old spiritual meaning approved by the Church: It stands for a commitment to follow Jesus, like Mary, the perfect model of all the disciples of Christ. This commitment finds its origin in baptism by which we become children of God. Our Blessed Mother has promised special Graces and protection to those who are enrolled and wear her Brown Scapular night and day, showing our devotion to Mary by professing our devotion through prayer each day, to live as authentic Christians in line with the teaching of the Gospel, and to receive the Sacraments. 'On 13th October 1917, at the "Great Apparition" of Fatima, the children saw Our Lady as Queen of Carmel, with the scapular. We can more than reasonably assume she encourages this devotion'. It is a great way to follow the invitation of Bishop Patrick, announced at the Diocesan Pilgrimage to Walsingham 2018, to prepare ourselves for the re consecration of England as Our Lady's Dowry on the Feast of The Assumption later this year.
