The Cathedral is a place for quiet prayer and reflection - all are most welcome to take advantage of this oasis of peace in our busy world.

Today: There are many practical lessons to be drawn from today's gospel. All judgements belong to God. There are times, because of responsibilities I have in life, when I have to form opinions, and express opinions about people for whom I am responsible. This is very different from sitting in judgement on someone, when their behaviour is none of my business. There is an Indian prayer which goes something like this: "Lord, please don't let me judge my brother until I have walked a mile in his moccasins." Quite often what annoys me about others is when their behaviour reflects weaknesses I myself possess. When you point a finger at another, remember, you are pointing three fingers at yourself.

A woman brought her daughter to Mahatma Ghandi one time, asking him to place his hand on her head, to recite a prayer over her, and to free her from the addiction she had. Ghandi asked what the addiction was, and the mother said that her daughter was addicted to sweet things, like sugar, sweets and sweet cakes, etc. Ghandi thought for a while, and he then asked the mother to bring her daughter home, and to return one month later. This seemed strange, but the mother did what she was asked. One month later, she arrived with her daughter. Ghandi placed his hand on the young girl's head, prayed a prayer over her, and he then told the mother to bring her daughter home, because from now on, everything would be ok. The mother, more puzzle than annoyed, asked Ghandi why he was able to do something this day, and not on the previous occasion. Ghandi smiled, as he told the mother that, up to one month ago, he, too, was very fond of sweet things! (MB)

Day of Prayer for Victims and Survivors of Sexual Abuse On Friday 12th April the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales is encouraging the Catholic community to take part in a day of prayer for survivors of sexual abuse. The following is adapted from the words Pope Francis spoke at the World Meeting of Families in Dublin, August 2018. He reflected upon meeting with eight persons who are survivors of the abuse of power, the abuse of conscience and sexual abuse and wished to implore the Lord's mercy for these crimes and to ask forgiveness for them. We ask forgiveness for the cases of abuse in the Church, the abuse of power, the abuse of conscience and sexual abuse on the part of representatives of the Church. In a special way, we ask forgiveness for all those abuses that took place in different kinds of institutions directed by men and women religious and other members of the Church. We also ask forgiveness for cases in which many minors were exploited for their labour. We ask forgiveness for all those times when, as a Church, we did not offer to the survivors of any type of abuse compassion and the pursuit of justice and truth by concrete actions. We ask forgiveness. We ask forgiveness for some members of the hierarchy who took no responsibility for these painful situations and kept silent. We ask forgiveness. We ask forgiveness of those children who were taken away from their mothers and for all those times when so many single mothers tried to find their children that had been taken away, or those children who tried to find their mothers, were told that this was a mortal sin. It is not a mortal sin; it is the fourth commandment! We ask forgiveness. May the Lord preserve and increase this sense of shame and repentance, and grant us the strength to ensure that it never happens again and that justice is done. Amen.
