In addition to the 1pm weekday Mass, Mass will be celebrated in the Lady Chapel at 7.30am on Monday and Tuesday and at 6.15pm on Monday in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel.

Palm Sunday This weekend the Church commemorates Our Lord's entry into Jerusalem, when people greeted Him waving branches. Palms will be blessed and distributed at all Masses. Please remember during Holy Week to prepare spiritually, do celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession).

The Easter Offering traditionally goes to the Priests of the Parish and forms the major part of their income for the year. Priests here in the Cathedral do not receive any income from any other source outside of the Parish. The Cathedral is a place for quiet prayer and reflection - all are most welcome to take advantage of this oasis of peace in our busy world.

Today: Two young men of Irish origins were together in Vietnam. One was called Manning, and the other was called Brennan, and both names are about as Irish as you can find! They were part of a platoon making their way through the jungle when, suddenly, Manning was sent flying into the bushes, as Brennan threw himself on the ground. There was a terrific explosion, as a landmine blew Brennan to bits, and Manning escaped without a mark. Manning was deeply shocked, of course, but he was also profoundly overcome that his friend had sacrificed his own life for him. His right foot was just about to come down on the mine when Brennan spotted it, and dived. His intention was to get Manning out of the way, but it was impossible to do that without throwing himself in the line of fire.

When Manning returned to the US, he joined a branch of the Franciscans, called the Canons Regular. He took "Brennan" as his religious name, and for many years, books and tapes from Fr Brennan Manning TOR were to be found on the shelves of all religious bookstores. Some years after his ordination, he was visiting the mother of his friend Brennan, who was now quite old. She was a quiet little woman, and constant prayer was her daily sustenance. By way of saying something, during a lull in their conversation, Manning turned to her and asked, "Do you think that he really loved me?" The quiet little woman sprang into life, was on her feet, and was pointing a finger into his face, as she spoke with a clear firm voice: "Don't ever ask that question again. Of course he loved you. Didn't he die for you? What further proof could you possibly need?" (MB)
