The Cathedral is a place for quiet prayer and reflection - all are most welcome to take advantage of this oasis of peace in our busy world.

Today: I remember an occasion when I was on pilgrimage to the Holy Land. One of the young men in our group was quite mentally limited, although his grasp of God, of Jesus, and the events of the gospel was uncanny. We arrived at the tomb in the Basilica and we joined a long line, waiting our turn to enter. One lady came out of the tomb, and was obviously deeply touched by the experience of her visit to such a sacred spot. She sat down outside the entrance, took out a tissue, and began wiping her tears. My friend, who was well back in the line, spotted what was happening, and responded instantly. He ran straight up to her, put his hand on her shoulders, and said, "Don't be crying. It's Ok. He's alive: don't you know that?" The whole thing was so spontaneous and genuine that the woman stood up, and gave him a warm hug. The simple fact was that he just could not understand how anybody could be crying at this tomb. Of all tombs in the world. Jesus thanked the Father for giving a message that was so simple and straightforward that the intellectual and the world-wise fail to grasp it, and yet it could be fully accepted by someone with the mind of a child. "Happy are they who have not seen, and yet believe....." (MB)
