**Today:** Psalm 23, "The Lord is my Shepherd" is attributed to King David who was a shepherd before being called to be King of Israel. It is one of the best loved prayers in the Bible.

The story is told that two people were asked to recite it for a congregation. The first was a Shakespearean actor but a non-believer. He did a magnificent job. He used the right tone of voice, the right inflection, the right emphasis, the right pace, and the right pauses. Every word was clearly and beautifully enunciated. All who heard him were deeply impressed. The second man got up – this time, a much older guy in his eighties. His delivery was poor. So too was his diction. He used mostly the same tone of voice throughout. He went too fast. Some of the emphasis was wrong. He paused in the wrong places. In short, he made every mistake an amateur reciter could make. But he had one powerful thing going for him: he spoke from the heart. He meant every word he said. The result was that his hearers were deeply moved. Later the actor came up to him and said, "Congratulations. You did a wonderful job." "I think I did a terrible job. It's you who did a wonderful job," he replied. One thing was for certain: the Shakespearean actor knew the psalm but the old man knew the Shepherd. (MB)

**Planning for the future:** from time to time it's a good idea to remind congregations about making a WILL. For if someone owns a property of any kind they should have a Will. If someone dies without one then maybe the State will help to decide how the property is distributed. People are funny. They are often reluctant to draw up a Will because it brings them too close to the reality of death. Or, they think that their estate is too small to bother. An occasional note in the church newsletter can serve as a reminder that the church can be a good beneficiary of a portion of an estate. This reminder can help people who have already made a Will but may have simply forgotten to include the church. Wills can be and should be looked at about every three years. There was a guy who had been active in his church for 38 years. At his death, he Willed a generous gift to his alma mater but had not visited in forty years. "But they asked," his wife explained. "And the church didn't."
