Today: St Stephen was the first disciple of Jesus to die for his faith. Stephen was young, generous and brave. He bore witness to Jesus in word and deed, and paid the ultimate price.

The most striking feature of his death is the resemblance it bears to the death of Jesus. Like Jesus, Stephen was innocent. Like Jesus, he was accused of blasphemy, and tried before the supreme council of the Jews, the Sanhedrin. Like Jesus, he died a violent death outside the city. (In this way both were turned into outcasts in death.)

Like Jesus, Stephen prayed for his killers: "Lord, do not hold this sin against them." Finally, as Jesus died he surrendered his soul into the hands of God with the prayer, "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit." As Stephen died he surrendered his soul into the hands of Jesus, saying, "Lord Jesus, Receive my spirit." In all of this, Luke's intent is clear: the death of the martyr mirrors the death of Jesus.

Besides showing us how to witness, Stephen shows us the kind of death to which every Christian should aspire, namely, to die forgiving one's enemies, and surrounding oneself to the goodness and mercy of the Lord. (MB)

The Cathedral Chapter of Canons The Chapter is a college of priests of the Diocese of Nottingham deputed to represent the Diocese in the celebration of public worship, particularly on the more solemn liturgical occasions, and to act at any time as advisors to the Bishop in the exercise of his pastoral office. The Chapter consists of eleven Canons, including the Provost and assemble four times a year in the Cathedral. Starting off our 175th Celebrations this coming week, the Canons will concelebrate the 1pm Mass each weekday with one of the Cathedral Clergy and one of the Canons will preach a short Homily and will also hear Confessions before Mass. We trust that you will join us in welcoming the Canons to the Cathedral for this wonderful occasion.
