John Bradburne Memorial Society There will be a 40th year Anniversary Mass and exhibition on Saturday 21st September 2019 at Westminster Cathedral at 2.30pm to celebrate the life and work of John Bradburne, whose cause for beatification as the first 20th century English saint is moving ahead this year. John spent years seeking God from the Malayan jungles in World War Two to wanderings in Europe and Israel, until he finally found his true place in the world caring for leprosy patients at the Mutemwa Leprosy Settlement in Zimbabwe. Today: This week's gospel is not the easiest gospel to understand. It does, however, call for some practical responses. "You're either with me or against me." It calls on me to state my position, to declare where I stand. This is something that I must do on a regular basis – even on a daily basis. Of course, I can expect to be tested, even by those closest to me. I will draw the snide remark, or the cynical comment. If I am convinced and convicted about my position, such attacks will go right over my head. I have nothing to defend. The words and promises of Jesus speak for themselves. If I become defensive, it could indicate that I'm not totally convinced about what it is I believe in.

A little story: The little girl inherited her mother's stubbornness, and there was often a flare-up, when the little one stomped her foot, and just refused to do what she was told. One day, it had gone too far, so the mother decided to get the better of her in some other way. She put a stool in the corner, and told her daughter to sit down there, and stay until her dad came home. She refused to sit, despite all the threats. Eventually, in frustration, the mother put her hand on the child's head, and pushed her down until she was sitting on the stool. Shortly after that, the dad came in, saw her sitting on the stool, and asked "Well, what are you doing over there?" To which he got the teeth-clenched answer "Outside, I'm sitting down, but inside I'm standing up!" (MB)
