### Cathedral Refurbishment

As you will read elsewhere in this week's bulletin we have raised a remarkable sum of money since the Refurbishment Fund was launched back in October 2011 - £41,855.68. My sincere thanks to all who have worked hard and donated whatever they could towards this sum, (especially considering the current economic situation and the detrimental effects of the City Council's decision to introduce the unfair and unjust Sunday and Evening Car Parking Charges). As a result of the fund raising we, however, been able to place orders or purchase; Acolyte Candles, Processional Cross, and a Crucifix for the Sacristy, Altar Cloths, and Altar Linen, Painting and Decorating of the Sacristy and Repairs and Varnishing of Garden Seats. As noted previously the Cathedral has been re-lamped, and all the outside lighting and flooding lighting repaired, as well certain remedial works in Cathedral House and re-pointing of brickwork above the Sacristy – all of this has been paid for and the money left over from the current fund raising total is £31,361. This amount will be put towards the purchase of a new PA System for the Cathedral, investigative works to decide how best to deal with the damp around the Cathedral Columns, repairs and refurbishing of the kneelers, and the re-instatement of the Sanctuary Lamp in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel. This past week I had meetings with the Cathedral Architect and Builders to decide how best to tackle the problems with the Columns. Also, this past week I hope to have been able to instruct a contractor/supplier to go ahead with repairs and refurbishment of the kneelers and to have instructed a contractor/supplier to commence the installation of a new PA System. I am extremely grateful for what we have achieved here at the Cathedral in such a short space of time. However, I am afraid we still do have to carry on raising money to be in a position to complete these works. If you are in a position to donate any sum towards these works, please do consider doing so, and please do remember to pray that the Cathedral and its Community will be able to continue its unique service to both the City and Diocese of Nottingham. *Fr Geoffrey*
