**Synodal Process** The next parish meeting will take place soon. These are the questions that we will be considering at this next session: **1. As a parish, do we know who are the people who feel marginalised or separated from the parish and society? 2. How best can our parish respond?** Suggest at least two identifiable ways (an immediate action and a long-term change) in which, as a parish, we will reach out to, and listen to, the marginalised or separated.
