Today: Walter Cizek, A Polish Jesuit priest, spent fifteen years in forced-labour camps in Siberia. Through all those years he belonged to the lowest-brigades, forced to do the dirtiest work – digging foundations by hand, loading and unloading construction materials, crawling in damp, dark mines, where death was only one careless step away.

What kept him going? "Men died in the camps," he said, "especially when they gave up hope. But I trusted in God, and so I never felt without hope. It was not I who kept the faith: it was the faith that kept me." Happy the one who possesses a faith like that! **(MB)**

Internal Redecoration of St Barnabas Cathedral 'Restoring Pugin' We are still on track with our application to the National Lottery Heritage Fund, for a grant to restore Pugin's decorative scheme in the three east chapels and their ambulatory. Our aim is to have the application ready for May, and there is still a great deal of work going on to prepare the application. Please pray that we will be successful in obtaining the Lottery Grant for these proposed restorations. We will keep you updated as things progress.

Although we are just concentrating on the three east chapels, you may have noticed that there have been other paint investigations near to the west door, and the Derby Road side. This sort of work is expensive, but we were able to fund it through the grant we received to restore the Nave Columns. We are hopeful that these exciting developments will help towards securing the Lottery Grant.
