Today: A fifty-year old guy was dying in the hospital – 'he had had a good life', so he said. He would have it all over again, if he could. He would gladly forgo money and health and all his riches, if only he could have the same wife, the same family, the same love again. "Love", he said, "was the important ingredient in life. It was love which kept things together and made sense of everything". The day before he died he sent for all the members of his family, who were, he said, quarrelsome and at odds with one another. He told them that they must learn to love one another – and they must try as hard as they could to do this. For Love was everything! EVERYTHING. They must believe this, for it was the words of a dying man.

Jesus spoke similar words to his friends the night before he died. He gave them a simple, clear message: "Love one another, just as I have loved you". **(MB)**

Returning to Mass at Pentecost Since the beginning of the Covid pandemic, until the present time, the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales have shared with you their judgment that the situation of the last two years has meant that the Sunday Obligation has been impeded and has needed to be fulfilled in other ways. We thank God that this situation has now changed. The pressing challenges of the pandemic have lessened significantly. Most people have resumed the wide range of normal activities, no longer restricted by the previous Covid measures. Therefore the Bishops' believe that the reasons which have prevented Catholics from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation no longer apply.
