The Sacraments of First Holy Communion and Confirmation Congratulations to the young children of the Cathedral Parish and the children of the RCIC who made their First Holy Communion this weekend at the 10am Saturday Mass.

Congratulations also to all those who were Confirmed last Sunday. We thank all those who helped to make the day go so well, especially to Deacon David, Barbara, Julie, Bridget and Ollie, for their dedication, hard work and talent in preparing our young people for these important steps in their journey of faith.

Today: Today is the Feast of The Most Holy Trinity, the day on which we celebrate the magnificent truth that God is a Family of Persons. By our baptism we were born of God the Father – and he really and truly became our Father on that day, because he gave us a share in his own divine life. God the Son became our brother, because we became like him. And the Father and the Son gave us a share in their love by giving us the Gift of the Holy Spirit, the bond of love that brings us into the inner family circle. In today's epistle, St Paul gives witness to our share in God's family: "The love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us."

A little story for today: there is a story about a Jew who had a sudden heart attack on the street. A priest appeared on the scene, knelt by the victim and asked if he were a Christian. The Jew looked perplexed. "Do you believe in the Trinity," persisted the priest, "you know the Three in One?" "My God," grasped the stricken Jew, "at a time like this...at a time like this, all he can offer me is a mathematical proposition!" **(MB)**
