Special Prayer for Grandparents Today we pray for all our grandparents that they may rejoice in their families and continue to be an inspiration to all their grandchildren. We also remember those grandparents who are no longer with us.

Today Prayer: the apostles saw Jesus, walk on water, calm the storm, and raise the dead; yet when they came to him with a request, it was, "Lord, teach us to pray". They saw that prayer was such a powerful force in his life, and they felt that the secret, lay there. Jesus often slipped away on his own, and spent a whole night in prayer. He did that before he chose his apostles, before his Sermon on the Mount, before he faced Calvary. They saw this, as the source of his strength, and they wanted what he had.

A little story for today: "I got up early one morning, and rushed into the day; I had so much to accomplish that I didn't have time to pray. Problems just tumbled about me, and heavier came each task. 'Why doesn't God help?' I wondered. He answered, 'Because you didn't ask'. I wanted to see joy and beauty, but the day toiled on grey and bleak. I wondered, 'Why didn't God show me?' He said, 'Because you didn't seek.' I tried to come into God's presence, I used all my keys at the lock. God gently and lovingly chided, 'My child, you didn't knock'. I woke up early this morning, and paused before entering the day. I had so much to accomplish, that I had to take time out to pray!" St Francis de Sales tells us, "Each Christian needs half an hour of prayer each day, except when they're busy; then we need an hour". **MB**

Outside Floodlights The floodlights that are currently sited at the Cathedral are expensive to run and those that are still working are hot to the touch, which causes a Health and Safety issue. To counteract these issues we have received permission from the Diocesan Building and Sites Committee to replace the lights with LED equivalent. The lights will be more environmentally friendly and will provide quality lighting to the Cathedral grounds. They will be cheaper to run and will enhance the Cathedral. The cost of these works comes in at £6,895.54 plus VAT. If you would like to help towards the cost, please speak to Canon Malachy or contact the Cathedral Office.
